- **Music Room:** Various musical instruments were procured to provide opportunity to the students to learn and grow.
- **Sports Room:** Equipped with a variety of sports-equipment. Spacious designated areas for indoor sports like Badminton, Table Tennis, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, etc.

### **Trainings, Seminars, Counselling and Orientations.**

Throughout the academic year 2024-2025, we focused on the continuous professional and academic development for both staff and students. Teachers training programs included workshops on innovative teaching methods, student-centred learning, and the use of digital tools in classrooms were conducted.

Seminars on leadership and pedagogy helped our teachers improve their mentoring skills. Counselling services were provided for both, students and staff, addressing academic, emotional, and career-related concerns, also promoting mental well-being. ### **1. Comprehensive Life-Saving Skills training on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2024**

### **2. POCSO (Awareness Seminar)**

#### **A journey into the wild ---**

**Two excursion trips to the were organized by the school for the secondary and senior secondary students to the beautiful wildlife sanctuary – Kanha National Park. The 1<sup>st</sup> trip was conducted for the students of class X & XII (28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> November 2024) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> trip was for the students of class IX & XI (18<sup>th</sup> December to 20<sup>th</sup> December 2024)**

The students embarked on an educational excursion to Kanha National Park, Madhya Pradesh. This trip aimed to provide students with firsthand experience of India’s rich biodiversity and to instil a deeper understanding of wildlife conservation. #### **\*Academic Enhancement Program\*-**

**Academic enhancement program focused on the improvement of the students academic performance and skills. Different programs were implemented at various levels, from middle school to senior secondary classes, to focus on specific areas like study and practice habits, enhancement of subject-specific knowledge.**

#### **\*Subject Specific Skill Development Classes for class IX & X\* -**

**It focused on developing effective study strategies, time management, and organizational skills, helping the cream students to polish their capabilities and become more efficient learners and improve their performance during the exams. The classes focused on the tips and tricks that could help improve the scorings of the students.**

#### **\*Learning Enhancement and Focus 20 Program for class XI - XII & VI - X respectively\*-**

**Teachers conducted extra classes to enhance specific skills of the slow bloomers like reading comprehension, writing, and critical thinking, providing students with the tools to develop and succeed in their weak areas of the specific subjects and grow academically.**

**Special Support for specific subjects helped them focus on particular subject areas, offering targeted support to students who were struggling with specific concepts.**

**Special one hour classes were organised for students of class XI - XII, post school hours to Bridge the learning gaps, and help them identify and address learning skills.**

To ensure students have a strong foundation in essential knowledge \*Focus 20\* classes were organised for the slow bloomers of classes VI to X. It helped the students increase their confidence and be motivated by providing them a supportive and structured environment. Mentors fostered a sense of confidence and motivation, by encouraging students to pursue their academic goals. They focused on every slow bloomer with their personal touch to polish and upgrade the students academic skills.

**\*Mega Classes for class X & XII\* - Mega orientation classes were conducted subject wise for the board students in between the CBSE exams to highlight on the paper solving tips and tricks, time management skills, focusing on important scoring topics. This helped the students to streamline with the concepts and scoring values upcoming exam.**
